Welcome to the Veronica Richards Suzuki Violin Studio! We offer lessons both virtually and in person and offer a variety of tuition options so that you can tailor your lesson experience to your needs.

TUITION

Monthly Tuition

If you choose a monthly tuition plan tuition will be due at the first lesson of each month. Please write a check payable to “Veronica Richards” for the total amount for the month.

Please note that the tuition amount may vary depending on the amount of lessons in the month. Always refer to the studio’s current calendar (see **STUDIO CALENDAR**) to check the amount of lessons in the month.

Semester/School Year Tuition

If you would like to pay for one semester at a time or the whole school year at a time please talk to Veronica about totaling the weeks in the semester.

Charter School Tuition

The studio is a registered vendor with over 10 charter schools. If you are enrolled in one of these schools please contact us to set up Purchase Orders for lessons.

Studio rates increase at a rate of \$2 at the beginning of each calendar year. Families in their first year with the studio are not eligible for the rate increase.

CANCELLATION POLICY**Sick Policy**

If a lesson is cancelled (by the student or teacher) due to sickness the student will receive full credit for the lesson (a refund is not available). This credit must be used up in the same semester or in the semester following. (E.g. if a lesson is cancelled in November due to sickness the credit should be used in December or January.) The credit will disappear if not used within that time frame.

Lessons Cancelled Not Due to Sickness

If you are cancelling a lesson due to a scheduling conflict please notify your teacher a full week in advance to receive a refund. If you do not let your teacher know a week in advance you must still pay for your lesson slot.

Lessons cancelled by the teacher

The studio offers a refund or make up lesson for any lesson cancelled by the teacher.

If you would like to schedule an extra lesson slot to use up credit please contact your teacher for make up lesson availabilities.

STUDIO ETIQUETTE for In-Person Lessons**Lesson Time**

Please arrive promptly for the lesson. Planning to arrive and unpack your instrument 2-5 min. before the start of your lesson is encouraged.

After the lesson please pack up quietly so as not to disturb the next student's lesson as it begins.

Materials

Each student family must bring a video-recording device to each lesson, so that the parent can film a practice video.

STUDIO ETIQUETTE for Virtual Lessons

Lesson Schedule

While unpacking, setting up and tuning up are all factored into an in-person lesson schedule, virtual lessons don't require us to be "together" for the set up. Likewise, practice videos and student notes can be completed by your teacher once the virtual lesson has ended. Hence virtual lessons will follow the schedule below (this sample schedule is for a 30min. lesson beginning at 1:00pm and ending at 1:30pm)

12:55 Student unpacks, tunes, set up music, music stand, pencil, etc.

1:00 Teacher calls student and lesson begins

1:20 Teacher films practice videos (w/ or w/o the student on the line)

1:25 Teacher hangs up and writes student's notes. Sends student practice video and notes.

1:30 Lesson ends.

Lesson "Team"

For all students under age 12 and for any student in the first 12 months of lessons it is important to have a parent, grandparent, older sibling present for a virtual lesson. It's important for each student to have a "team member" to touch their hand, mark their music, etc.

Lesson Materials

Make sure that you have all the following materials at hand for a virtual lesson:

- Electronic tuner
- Rosin
- Music stand (or music propped up on something and well-lit so the student doesn't have to bend down to see it)
- Music
- Pencil
- Power cord for your device

The Device

Using a computer, tablet, iPad or even a phone is perfectly acceptable for virtual lessons. Choose the device with the best cell/internet reception rather than the device with the biggest screen.

Make sure the device is plugged into a power source and in a stable, well-lit place before the lesson.

Position the student so that the camera can see the student's whole body at least from the waist up. If possible it is best for the student to stand for the lesson.

Platforms

The studio can conduct virtual lessons on the following platforms:

- Zoom
- FaceTime
- Skype
- WhatsApp
- Google Hangouts

If you would like to use a platform that the studio does not yet offer please let us know so that we can update accordingly.

Note regarding internet connection: Both FaceTime and WhatsApp have the ability to switch to cellular if the WiFi signal is slow. It's a good idea to have more than one virtual platform available in case one works better than the other on any given day.

PRACTICING - INFORMATION AND TIPS

Parent-student practice time. The most essential element of the Suzuki method is the home practicing that the student and parent will do together. Six days a week is optimal. While the lessons are important, the daily practice is the factor that determines success. Everyone improves with repetition, and daily repetition is the only way to cement the good habits in the muscles of the small violinist.

Make a good start. It is important that the parent and child follow a disciplined practice schedule from the very start. This way the child can see his/her improvements soon, and they will correlate their hard work with their improvement. Every family follows a unique schedule, so find a strategy for daily practice that works in your home. Most families find that practice is most effective at the same time every day. Find a time of day that works consistently on weekdays and weekends. Some families find that a regular practice fits in as part of the morning schedule along with brushing teeth, getting dressed and making beds. This couples practice time with other DAILY routines. Whether weekday or weekend, summer or holidays, everyone has to get dressed. This also gets the practice out of the way early, so that the student has free time after school and chores.

Less is more. When you are first beginning lessons, practice for five minutes every day. Set a timer so that you do not exceed that amount. This way the child will be encouraged (and surprised) by how short their practice time is. Every week you can increase the practice time by one minute. If you are too ambitious and increase by more than a minute the student will become weary of practice as the time gets longer and longer. Remember that a one-minute increase will lead you to a very substantial practice time very soon. Always use the timer, as it will teach young students to gage time accurately, and keep their practice schedule as consistent as possible.

Practice emergencies. There are many things that can interrupt a regular practice schedule, including house guests, illness, holidays, family vacations, family emergencies, etc. In these instances do not worry about missing a couple days of practice. If the student can play for just a couple minutes they will not regress, even if they cannot complete their weekly assignment. Just picking up the instrument and playing an easy review piece is a very effective way to maintain technique and motivation when the schedule is interrupted.

Jack of all trades, master of none. In order to maintain a regular practice schedule it is crucial not to over-schedule your child. Children who have activities, sports, extra classes, etc. have a

much harder time practicing regularly. The beauty of starting your Suzuki student at a young age is that they are not old enough to be committed to too many after-school activities. As they get older, schedule carefully so that they never feel overwhelmed, or feel tempted to skip their practice in order to take part in other activities. Students who are over-scheduled feel frustrated because they can never excel at everything, but will always be struggling to keep up in certain activities.

Learning by listening. Listening to the Suzuki CD daily is a **big** part of practicing. This is also the easiest part of practicing, since it can be done during other activities. Simply turn on the CD as background music during school or chores or meals, and repeat the songs that have been assigned as listening material in the lesson. Listening to the CD cuts hours off of practice time since the student absorbs many of the minute technicalities of the recording artist.
